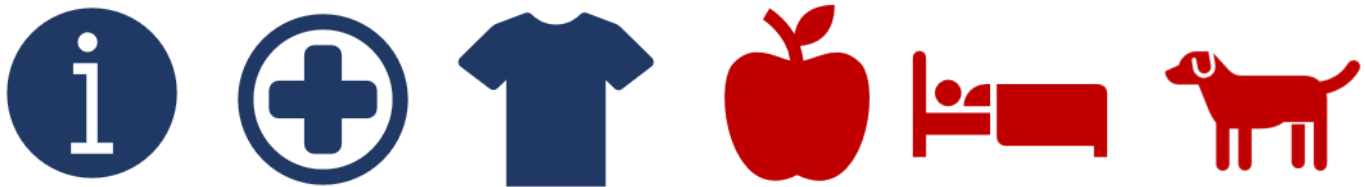

1. Coordinated Entry

Coordinated Entry is your first stop and best resource if you are homeless or about to become homeless.

Eligible households can access Coordinated Entry for homeless prevention and housing assistance through screening, assessment, and prioritization.

Please note, immediate housing resources are limited.

HOW DO I ENTER?

Step 1: Assess your Current Housing Situation

- **Literally Homeless:** You are sleeping outside, in a shelter, or somewhere not meant for human habitation.
- **Imminently Homeless:** You will lose your current housing in 14 days or less.
- **Housed:** You have a place to stay, even temporarily, including couch surfing or staying with family members.

Step 2: Call 2-1-1

No matter which category you fall under, you can call 2-1-1 to get information about resources and programs that are available to you.

Step 3: In-Person Services for those who are Literally Homeless

In-person Coordinated Entry service is only available to people who meet the following requirements:

- Are Literally Homeless
- DO NOT already have an assigned Housing Navigator
- HAVE NOT already started the Coordinated Entry process

If you meet these 3 criteria you may go to the Carnegie Resource Center at 3001 Oakes Ave, Everett WA 98201, Monday-Friday at 1pm-4pm. Sign-in at 12:45pm-3:20pm. Please note that due to time restraints, they typically only have time to see the first 3 clients that sign in.

Transportation to shelter provided from 3 locations:

1. Lynnwood City Hall at 7pm every day (except Wednesdays at 8:50pm)
2. Bus stop on Westbound 196th St. and Highway 99 at 7:05pm every day (except Wednesdays 8:55pm)
3. The Value Village Sign on Southbound 172nd St. and Highway 99 at 7:35pm every day.

Transportation back to City Hall provided the next morning at 7am. Bags and people are searched at the shelter to keep everyone safe. Policy of "No Alcohol, Drugs, Drug Paraphernalia, or Weapons" strictly enforced.

Renter Resources



1. Security Deposits

Assistance for security deposits is very limited in the community. As you start reaching out for assistance, look for other ways to save money. For example:

- Evaluate how you can reduce other bills or save money in other places in your budget.
- Talk to your friends or family who could help or loan money.
- If you are part of a church community or support organization, ask if they might assist members financially.
- Submit a written request to your landlord to pay your security deposit in an installment plan over 3 months. Please view this website for more details: <https://www.washingtonlawhelp.org/resource/tenants-new-legal-protection-from-discrimination-based-on-source-of-income>

Possible Resources:

Please understand that resources are very limited, and that each agency has their own eligibility criteria.

- **DSHS – Cash Diversion or AREN Grant**

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1. McKinney-Vento Act

If you have no permanent place to live, federal law allows you to keep your child in the same school at no added cost to you. Under the McKinney-Vento Act, children in homeless situations have the right to:

- Go to school, no matter where they live or how long they have lived there.
- Attend either the local school or the school of origin, if this is in their best interest; the school of origin is the school the child attended when they were permanently housed or the school in which the child was last enrolled.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if missing records and documents normally required for enrollment, such as a birth certificate, proof of residence, previous school records, or immunization/medical records.
- Enroll, attend classes, and participate fully in all school activities while the school gathers records.
- Have access to the same programs and services that are available to all other students, including transportation and supplemental educational services.
- Attend school with children not experiencing homelessness; a school cannot segregate a student because they were homeless.
